

- Distributed over 500 I love NC signs and 2020 Graduation signs with the assistance of SLOBS volunteers




## The Henry S. Coleman Endowed Scholarship

Henry S. Coleman was a former Dean of Financial Aid, Director of Admissions and Dean of Students at Columbia University. He lived in New Canaan for over 50 years, chaired the Board of Education and was one of the founders of the NCHS Scholarship Fund. He served on the Grant and Aide Committee until his death in 2006.


## The Kelsey Durkin Endowed Scholarship




Paul is "old school" in all the best interpretations of the phrase. He believes in:




